Retail activity continues to grow in Foley, with a number of new businesses opening recently. ULTA Cosmetics, Home Goods, Marshall's and Five Below are adding to the shopping opportunities in Foley. We anticipate that Publix will open sometime this summer and Buffalo Wild Wings should break ground in May or June.

Foley Main Street hosted their first event with a musical performance in March. About 100 people attended this

very enjoyable performance. We look forward to more events coming to downtown.

Another entertainment venue will be opening soon on County Road 20 across from Wolf Bay Lodge. Your family will have the opportunity to sharpen their golfing skills at a new miniature golf course.

OWA has a number of exciting announcements. Legends in Concert, touted as the longest-running show in Las Vegas, is building a 430-seat theatre at OWA. They hope to be open by Memorial Day.

OWA also announced they will begin Phase II, a \$100 million investment that will include the Gulf Coast's largest indoor waterpark, an accompanying 200-room resort hotel with conference space, and a luxury, family-friendly RV Park.

Phase II construction will begin this summer. Tentative completion dates currently target the end of 2019 for the RV park opening, with an early 2021 opening for the hotel and indoor water park.

With the addition of Phase II, the Creek Indian Enterprises Development Authority (CIEDA), the economic development arm of the Poarch Band of Creek Indians, will top \$350 million in investments in Foley to develop OWA into a year-round Alabama resort destination.

These new projects will add greatly to the

employment in our area and help strengthen our economy.

The Foley Sports Tourism team is kicking into high gear. In February, almost 2,000 archers competed in the ASA Archery Pro/Am Tournament at Graham Creek Nature Preserve. April is a full month, beginning with youth soccer, followed by senior golf at GlenLakes, and ending with the USA Ultimate Southeast College Regionals, with men and women competing in

ultimate Frisbee. These events will keep our hotels, restaurants and retail stores busy.

A workshop was recently held to identify possible uses for the Hamburg building, which was donated by the Hamburg family to the city. This is the last remaining potato shed in Foley. Many Foley families have fond memories of visiting Hamburg's for feed, seed and baby chicks. We were fortunate to receive a grant from the Alabama Historical Commission to help plan for restoration of this building.

The Gulf Coast Hot Air Balloon Festival, an area favorite, is scheduled for Friday and Saturday, May 3 and 4. On Thursday, May 2, The Tanger Outlet Center will host the balloon glow event.

Mothers' Day weekend, May 11 and 12, marks the 47th Art in the Park. This family-friendly event will feature approximately 110 exhibitors displaying original art work. There will also be entertainment, children's activities and a variety of food vendors. Bring Mom and make her day special!

Project Shield | Foley's Community

As part of ongoing efforts to provide the best police services to citizens, FPD's Criminal Intelligence Unit is proud to announce a new crime-fighting partnership known as Project Shield.

Project Shield is a partnership between local businesses, private citizens and the police, aimed at reducing crime by building a database of existing surveillance cameras throughout the city. The database is a tool to help solve crime quickly and to potentially prevent crime. Crimes can be solved more quickly when they occur on camera. This database will allow officers to know what residences or businesses possess cameras in the vicinity of a crime.

Project Shield and similar projects are already in place in other locations and have proven to be very successful. This partnership will help build a safer community.

We are looking for participants who will partner with the Foley Police Department to make this project successful. Any business or private citizen who has an existing surveillance camera system is eligible and encouraged to participate.

Please contact us at (251) 952-4010 or records@foleypolice. org. As a benefit for joining, participants will receive one-onone training in identifying and reporting suspicious activity. Participants will also receive a decal to place in a window, showing participation in the project. The decals could prove to be a deterrent to a would-be criminal.

Development Corner

Highlights from the Foley's Community Development Department March Report. The report is available in its entirety at www.cityoffoley.org/cityboards/agendasandminutes.

From Oct. 1 - March 31, the Community Development Department (CDD) issued 112 new single-family residential permits; 4 duplexes (8 units); and 60 new multi-family units at The Reserve on CR 12, for a total of 180 new residential units.

New commercial permits include Storage Choice Bldgs B & C, Cube Smart and a ride at OWA. The valuation for this work is \$9,327,780. The CDD issued 43 commercial addition and remodel permits with a valuation of \$7,355,785. The total number of permits for this period is 1,101, with a valuation of \$48,907,153. Building inspectors performed 5,507 inspections.

Planning Commission actions for this period were as follows: Preliminary subdivision approval was granted for 7 subdivisions (482 lots). Minor subdivision (5 lots or less) approval was granted for 5 subdivisions (20 lots). In the Extra-Territorial Jurisdiction, preliminary subdivision approval was granted for 3 subdivisions (32 lots), and 1 Minor subdivision (2 lots). A site plan for Buffalo Wild Wings was reviewed and approved.

The new FEMA Flood Maps take effect in April 2019. Foley joined the FEMA Community Rating System (CRS) in 2017 to provide citizen discounts for flood insurance. Chuck Lay, Chief Building Inspector, serves as Floodplain Administrator and will be glad to assist with any questions. Foley ranks number four in the nation with homes that meet FORTIFIED standards, with 1,062 homes meeting the criteria as of March 2019, according to Smart Home America. ■


Foley Library Summer Reading Program

Foley Main Street to present the results of consumer & business surveys

Surveys are in!

In February and March, Foley Main Street distributed business and consumer surveys to residents, visitors and business owners. Collectively more than 1,100 surveys were processed. Thank you to everyone who participated.

Information from the surveys is being compiled to gather important information to direct the growth of downtown Foley. The results will provide indicators on many different topics, including housing, safety and social media. Survey results will help Foley Main Street and the city prioritize projects to address issues that are important to residents and business owners in downtown Foley.

A report detailing the survey results will be presented to the public on Friday, June 7. The presentation, given by Jay Schlinsog with Downtown Professionals Network, will be hosted by Foley Main Street and Main Street Alabama. The meeting will be held in the Council Chambers at City Hall at 8 a.m. The general public is invited to attend. Coffee and donuts will be served. Improvements coming to intersection of Foley Beach Express and County Road 12

Foley is working to make the intersection of the Foley Beach Express and County Road 12 safer with enhancements funded by a Federal Highway Safety Improvement Program grant and funding from the city. The list of desired improvements, which includes offset left-turn lanes on the Foley Beach Express, widening County Road 12 to include dedicated right-turn lanes, left-turn lanes, eastbound and westbound lanes, and improved lighting, could take up to two years.

Foley has entered an agreement with the Alabama Department of Transportation to construct offset left-turn lanes on the Foley Beach Express at County Road 12. This project will reduce the amount of distance required to make a left hand turn, making the intersection safer. This part of the project will be funded with a federal grant administered by the Alabama Department of Transportation. The grant will cover 90 percent of the \$326,460 project, with the city picking up the balance.

The city has earmarked \$300k in the FY19 budget for intersection improvements, and anticipates another \$300k being approved in the FY20 budget.

Fire Prevention Message

The Foley Fire Department reminds you to practice fire safety every day. Check your smoke alarms periodically and replace them every 10 years to insure that they are properly protecting you and your family. Remember that carbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless, odorless gas that can be deadly in your home. Consider installing carbon monoxide alarms if your home has an attached garage and/or has fuel-fired appliances.

Our area is prone to severe weather, especially during spring and summer months. Be sure to stay weather aware by downloading a good weather app on your mobile device or using a weather alert radio in your home. After a thunderstorm safely passes, check your home for lightning damage. We have had several homes damaged by lightning in Foley over the past year. Finally, May 1 is the effective date of the annual ADEM Burn Ban in Baldwin County. Open burning of debris is prohibited until Nov. 1, with only a few exceptions (recreational/ceremonial/cooking fires, agricultural/silvicultural burns).
